

# Apostrophes

Apostrophes (‘) are used when writing the shorter form of a word.

Example: The word ‘is not’ can be changed into ‘isn’t’ by adding an apostrophe before the ‘t’.

Apostrophes should not be used for a plural unless it is a possessive apostrophe, e.g. Susan’s hat.

Example: Incorrect – ball’s

Correct – balls
