## **Proper Nouns**

Some nouns belong to a group called <u>proper nouns</u>. A proper noun is the name of a <u>particular person</u>, place or thing.

'Particular' meaning something which is unique (only one of its kind).

## Example of proper nouns:

- The <u>names of people</u> are proper nouns because they are unique and individual names of people.
- The <u>names of countries and cities</u> because they own a unique name for their nation or land.

Proper nouns always begin with capital letters.

Example: God, Anna, Egypt, Earth, Martin Luther King, British Museum.
