

Singular and Plural

Nouns which have a vowel before the letter 'y' can be changed into a plural by adding an '-s'.

Example: 'boy' – the letter 'o' is a vowel, and has the letter 'y' at the end, the plural for the word boy will therefore be 'boys'.

The plurals of some nouns can be formed by changing the 'y' into 'ies' if the singular noun has a consonant before the 'y'.

Example: **city ---- cities**
