'Neither' is used to describe none of the two whereas 'either' is used to describe one or the other.

a. (either, neither) Fred nor Tia turned up to work today.

b. It is possible to take (either, neither) the train or the bus to Leeds.

c. The competition was tough, the winner was (either, neither) Tom or Stacey.

d. The eruption of the volcano was predicted for (either, neither) May or June.

e. Toast can be eaten with (either, neither) butter or jam.

f. Anna's uncle was (either, neither) a teacher or a manager, but a dentist.

g. The street was (either, neither) on the left or the right.
