Collective Noun

A collective noun is a word which indicates a group of people or things, but is referred to as one whole.

Example: a team – the word 'team' and 'army' both symbolise a number of people and not one person or thing. Therefore, when the noun is referred to as a group the verb will be singular.

Correct sentence: This football team <u>is</u> admired by many people. (Singular verb) Incorrect sentence: This football team <u>are</u> admired by many people. (Plural verb)
