

Personal Pronoun and Reflexive Pronoun

Personal Pronoun: A personal pronouns stands for the person speaking, being spoken to, or being spoken of.

Example: he, she, I, you, him, her, you, your, we, us, its.

Reflexive Pronoun: A reflexive pronoun is formed by adding 'self' to **my, your, him, her, it, our, your, and, them.**

Example: myself, yourself, himself, herself, itself, themselves, ourselves.
