Use of Correct Verb

The subject (noun) of a sentence can be **singular (one)** or **plural (many).** A verb has to agree with its subject; therefore, if the noun is singular the verb must also be singular.

singular.
Example of incorrect sentence: The <u>cars</u> (plural subject) <u>was</u> (singular verb) parked.
Example of correct sentence: The <u>cars</u> (plural subject) <u>were</u> (plural verb) parked.
