## **Masculine and Feminine**

The gender of a noun indicates whether it is masculine, feminine or neuter.

- Masculine (male) example: man, tiger, priest.
- <u>Feminine</u> (female) example: women, tigress, priestess.
- Neuter (neither male nor female) example: table, chair, and pen.

**Example**: Girl is feminine.

Boy is masculine.

The man lost his wallet.

The **women** lost her purse.
